Rules and Guidelines

These rules are for the 2024 NUCA of Central Florida Inshore Classic. Interpretation of these rules will be left exclusively to the Tournament Director. Any rule changes will immediately supersede all previously published copies of rules. It is your responsibility to read and understand the rules.

- ENTRY FEES AND PAYMENTS:** An Entry Fee is required to fish the event. An optional Calcutta competition for largest red and largest trout will be held at the tournament, to participate an additional \$50 cash for each species, per team, is due prior to launch.
- SPORTSMANSHIP:** Competitors in the NUCA Inshore Classic tournament are expected to follow high standards of sportsmanship, courtesy, safety, and conservation. Any infraction of these fundamental sporting principles may be deemed cause for disqualification. Maximum courtesy must always be practiced, especially regarding boating and angling in the vicinity of non-competitors. Any act deemed by the Tournament Director that gives a team or angler an unfair advantage not specifically covered under this set of rules shall be grounds for disqualification.
- SAFETY:** Safe boating should always be observed. Tournament may be shortened or canceled due to unsafe weather conditions. The decision to shorten or cancel will be left to the discretion of the Tournament Director.
- PERMITTED FISHING METHODS:** All Redfish and Sea Trout must be caught alive in a conventional sporting manner. Artificial, live, or dead bait may be used during competition. Competitors may not catch fish or submit fish that have been caged or confined in an area prior to the tournament.
- LOCATIONS:** Competitors may fish anywhere on tournament waters accessible to the public, except areas designated as “off limits” or “no fishing” by private ownership, or local, state & federal officials.
- FISHING TIME, LAUNCH, AND WEIGH-IN:** Teams must check in at **either** at the Captain’s meeting at Outriggers Tiki Bar & Grill on September 12th, **or** at River Breeze Park on September 13th from 6:00 to 6:30am. Lines in at safe light. “Weigh in” is 12pm until 12:30pm at River Breeze Park. All teams must check in their fish photos by 12:30pm. Any team not checked in by 12:30pm will be disqualified. All photos of fish must be time marked before 12pm. Tournament director is official timekeeper.
- TEAMS:** A team consists of no more than 3 anglers, one of which must be designated as the captain.
- SCORING:** This is a **Catch & Release Tournament**. Each team will be provided with a tournament ruler mat. When a fish is caught, it will be placed on the ruler mat with the measurement clearly visible, and a picture taken. The picture must include the entire fish as well as the measurement. Each team will be eligible to present one Redfish and one Sea Trout entry. First, second, and third will be determined by total points. **Note: 1” = 1 point. Example: Redfish 38 1/2” + 25 1/2” Seatrout = 64 Points. A fish over 50” = 50 points.**

- TIES:** Ties shall be broken by the Largest Redfish for the Event. The team with the longest single Redfish shall receive precedence. The team with the most points will be deemed as the winner.

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
